EDDIE MUKAAYA, UGANDA

Founder and Executive Director of HEAR HIS VOICE UGANDA; with his daughter, who has a CI, and was a Child Ambassador for CI, he spoke at WHO at the beginning of the work on the World Hearing Report. Eddie began HEAR HIS VOICE UGANDA in August 2016 with mobilization of families, parents and care givers of hearing impaired children using hearing technology like hearing aids and Cochlear implants. This resulted into the formation a strong Parents group spearheading the family support and advocacy program of Hear His Voice Uganda. Eddie is a member of the Steering Group of CIICA.





SUE ARCHBOLD

A Teacher of the deaf who has been involved in Cochlear Implant for over 30 years, coordinated Nottingham CI Programme for 14 years and Chief Executive of The Ear Foundation for 8 years. She is General Secretary of European Symposium of Paediatric Cochlear Implantation and contributed to the World Report on Hearing and is a member of Core working group at the World Hearing Forum.

PAIGE STRINGER, MA, MPH, USA

Executive Director and Founder of Global Foundation For Children With Hearing Loss GFCHL helps babies and young children with hearing loss in developing countries access the locally-based services and expertise they need to listen, talk, and thrive Born with severe/profound hearing loss; Cochlear implant and hearing aid user Helped lead development of communications strategy for the WHO World Report on Hearing Member of core advisory team for WHO Resolution and World Report on Hearing committee. CONNIE MAYOR

Connie Mayer is a Professor in the Faculty of Education at York University and Academic Co-ordinator of the Teacher Preparation Program in the Education of Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHH) students. Before this, Connie worked as a teacher of the deaf for more than twenty years in a range of communication settings and her special interests are in language and literacy, CI in children, communication approaches and teacher education. She is currently working on research on literacy outcomes in deaf children, and is leading CIICA's research into adult services after CI.
