Diagnosis: Family Point Of View



- Preterm at 26 weeks
- We missed checking the ears
- At 12 months I started suspecting the hearing loss
- Diagnosis done at the lions clinic in Nairobi and fitted with hearing aids at 28 months
- I heard about Cochlear Implants when Elaine was about three years.
- But She only got to be implanted after a year later

THE OPTION OF CI FOR FUNDING

- In the absence of government funding, Parents or the family need adequate information to be able to perform a through Cost Benefit analysis for CI journey.
- Discuss how to go about the initial Implant cost:
- In Uganda import goods would attract about 35.5%
 - Value added Tax 18%, Import Duty tax 15%, infrastructure tax 1.5% and NDA of 1%
- After our visit at the WHO in Geneva in March 2017 we Engaged gov't on how they could make Hearing technology accessible to Ugandans.

They made a passionate request for Tax Expansion on Medical devices used for treating of Hearing Loss.

According to world Health Organization, over 466 million people live with disabling hearing loss and 90% of people with hearing loss live in low and middle-income countries which often lack resources and strategies to address Hearing Loss. However, with the advancement in technology, medical devices such as digital Hearing Aids, Cochlear Implants, and Intensive Auditory Verbal Therapy make a speaking and hearing world a reality for people with Hearing

In Uganda, comprehensive re/habilitation services are just emerging and these devices are too expensive for the majority of patients and clients who would otherwise benefit from them.

I therefore request you to exempt the Hearing Loss Medical technologies (Hearing aids, cochlear implants, hearing aids batteries and other assistive hearing accessories from Taxation. This will help to support children and the senior citizens who are most hit with hearing loss.
