### **BARBARA KELLEY**

Kris English, PhD, is a professor emeritus at the School of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology at the University of Akron in Akron, Ohio. Her specialty areas are counseling and pediatrics. She is a past president of the American Academy of Audiology.

### **SHARI EBERTS**

Shari Eberts is a passionate hearing health advocate and internationally recognized author and speaker on hearing loss issues. She is the founder of Living with Hearing Loss, a popular blog and online community for people with hearing loss, and an executive producer of We Hear You, an award-winning documentary about the hearing loss experience. Her book, Hear & Beyond: Live Skillfully with Hearing Loss, (co-authored with Gael Hannan) is the ultimate survival guide to living well with hearing loss. Shari has an adult-onset genetic hearing loss and hopes that by sharing her story, she will help others to live more peacefully with their own hearing issues





### **ROBERT MANDARA**

Robert Mandara, Electronic & Electrical Engineering BEng(Hons), was born with hereditary sensorineural deafness in 1968. He wore hearing aids from 1972 and received sequential bilateral cochlear implants in 2014 and 2016. Although British, he has lived almost half of his life in Finland where he serves on the CI committee and International Working Group of Kuuloliitto, the Finnish Hard of Hearing Association. In 2019 he was elected 1st Vice-President of EURO-CIU, the European association of CI users. He has volunteered twice at European Friendship Week and is very keen to encourage young CI users into advocacy. He was involved in the development of the CIICA website and continues to be an active member of CIICA's Communication group.





### **DARJA PAJK**

Darja Pajk is an occupational therapist employed in the field of social care in Slovenia. As an adult, she gradually lost her hearing completely and began to educate herself in the field of reality theory and neurolinguistic programming and coaching to make her easier to accept the situation - hearing loss. She takes an active part in raising awareness and understanding of hearing loss at national and international levels and is an active member of EFHOH, CIICA and the World Hearing Forum group Make listening safe. Her presentations always give a good insight into life with hearing loss and an understanding of gradual loss and complete deafness and the need for lifelong care for people with hearing loss. Now she uses cochlear implants on both sides.

Cristiane Malheiros, Manu's mother, has been doing voluntary work for 19 years, guiding families who are faced with deafness. Cristiane is 48 years old and owns her accountant office.
