Lack of awareness

Hearing loss as an invisible disability

The burden of unaddressed HL borne by the community – Family as the basic unity of a community

Parents are working 24/7 without rest and recreation allowance; no change of shifts Emotionally exhausting to the parents and family.

In order to circumvent the social stigma, Parents need: emotional and social support through parents' groups; Education support for professional intervention



Why Parents as advocates

- Parents have the stories: They do what they do, putting in all their worth hoping to harness the future of their children.
- Without budget targets they sacrifice resources to the cultivate the success stories which are the basis advocacy.
- They are not motivated by statistics; their motivation is the transformation in their children's lives
