#### Introduction

Leo De Raeve welcomed the Board and Full Members, and the 43 Community Members who attended as observers. He explained that we became a legal entity on 8 Feb 2023 and this was therefore our first GA, in our legal home: Maison Associations Internationale, Rue Washington 40, 1050 Brussels. He reminded the meeting of the Vision and Goals of CIICA.AISBL:

#### Vision:

• CIICA is led by users and family groups, working closely with professional organisations, experts in the field of CI and other stakeholders to increase access to cochlear implantation and lifelong support for those who could benefit from them.



**CIICA** achieves this by:

- Raising the international global awareness of the health, social and economic benefits of cochlear implants for those who could benefit from implantation, health care practitioners and wider society.
- Empowering user led advocacy and awareness raising activity to influence governments and health funders to invest in addressing the under provision of CIs and other implantable technologies, related to habilitation, after care and upgrades.
- Supporting CI advocates with the tools they need to achieve this change.

## **Finance Report**

Ruth Warick, Treasurer, summarised the end of year (December) accounts for 2023, prepared by our accountants, JP Gilissen, for submission to the National Bank of Belgium. Our bank accounts are held by KBC International, with signatories Ruth Warick, Leo De Raeve, Chair, Harald Seidler (Vice Chair) and Sue Archbold (Co-ordinator). Two signatories required under 5K Euros, and three over 5K.

The full accounts were available for attendees and Ruth Warick shared the summary:

## Summary of income and expenditure for year ending Dec 2023:

She reported on our funding sources: Cochlear, Advanced Bionics, Canadian social research fund, earned income, donations.

## Review of 2023

Sue Archbold, Co-ordinator, shared a review of the year, which indicated a 20% growth in members to 556 individuals and 109 organisations from 66 countries. It also indicated a corresponding growth in website activity.

## CIICA developed two types of online events:

CIICA Live with presentations, and CIICA CONVERSATIONS, small group conversations with a specific topic. The Conversations are becoming active groups to initiate change on individual themes.

## Research

Cochlear Implants in Deaf and Deafened adults: a global consultation on lifelong aftercare Research grant from Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, Canada, via York University, Toronto, with the Principal Investigator, Professor Connie Mayer. Over 1000 responses from 30 countries, which resulted in a report and Briefing which is now widely used to support advocacy work.

## Summary budget for 2024 (Euros)

Ruth Warick presented the budget for 2024, attached, and commented that to date we are working to budget, with the conference income and expenditure being a new item this year.
